He was a professor of Political Science at Al-Najah University in Nablus and served as a chief editorial writer for the Palestinian daily al-Quds.

7:00 PM	Over dinner, meeting with Ambassador <b>Michael Ratney</b> , US Consul General in Jerusalem. Before assuming his duties in Jerusalem in 2012, Ratney was Deputy Assistant Secretary for International Media and prior to that, he established and served as the first Director of the Office of International Media Engagement at the State Department. He served as Spokesman for the State Department's Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs and as Deputy Chief of Mission at the American Embassy in Doha, Qatar, as well as tours in Mexico City, Baghdad, Beirut, Casablanca, and Washington, DC. <i>(Amb. Ratney will arrive around 7:15 PM)</i>

10:30 AM	Meeting with journalist <b>Lili Galili,</b> an expert on minority groups in Israel, a former Haaretz writer and currently a contributor to i24.com, a Tel Aviv- based multilingual multimedia news service.

1:30 PM – 3:00 PM	Meeting with strategic affairs expert <b>Yossi Alpher</b> . Alpher is the author of Peace Now's weekly analysis of strategic affairs, Hard Questions, Tough Answers. Alpher served for 12 years in Israel's Mossad. While serving as the director of the Jaffee Center for Strategic Studies at Tel Aviv University, Alpher coordinated and coedited the JCSS research project on options for a Palestinian settlement, and produced "The Alpher Plan" for an Israeli- Palestinian territorial settlement. Since 1992 he has coordinated several track II dialogues between Israelis and Arabs.
